TASK FORCE RECONSIDERATION

Ratifying or rescinding TF decision to retain Prescription Drugs/all 10 EHB <u>Previous discussion (Sept. 28, 2015)</u>:

- Bundled vs unbundled
- "Cadillac tax" jeopardy
- MOOP concerns
- Consumers support Rx
- Legislators likely support Rx
- Most small businesses currently provide and pay

- Growing cost of health care threatens Prepaid
- As EHB, is mandate for individuals
- As "option" is outside Prepaid but if mandated as EHB must be paid by employer
- Argument can be made for actuarial value of Prepaid benefits
- DHHS opinion unknown

TASK FORCE RECONSIDERATION

Ratifying or rescinding TF decision to retain all 10 EHB, esp. Prescription Drugs

Pros for Keeping Rx Benefit	Cons for Keeping Rx Benefit
 Health care dependence on prescription drugs: Good public policy mandates coverage Exclusion means inadequate coverage Public hearing input (limited) supports Rx benefits Legislators and HHS expected to support Eliminating currently available benefit unpopular 	 If mandated for small business then Prepaid requires small employers to pay Cost trend for Rx may result in backlash against Prepaid Risk of "Cadillac Tax" penalties

PIG recommends revisiting previous decision

PIG Report - Waiver/Modification "Next Steps"

a. <u>Small Business Tax Credit</u>. Should TF rescind decision to waive small business tax credit with in-state administration? Alternative is to maintain processing by IRS.

	Pros: Waiving/Processing In-State	Cons: Waiving/Processing In-State
•	Will fund depleted Prem. Supplementation program at DLIR Potentially more up-take on tax credit by local businesses	 Eligibility for tax credits isn't the same for ACA as it is for Prepaid May establish a new state obligation to provide credits even if federal funds are insufficient
	DOSINESSES	 Making the case to HHS and IRS will complicate waiver proposal and actuarial/economic analysis Increases DLIR responsibilities to administer and report

<u>PIG recommendation</u>: Keep responsibility for processing tax credit at IRS.

- Ins Div qualifies and DLIR certifies QHPs
- Any insurer can offer small business QHPs businesses have more options
