Former State Representative Diana “Mele” Carroll

WHEREAS, Representative Diana “Mele” Carroll was born on May 9, 1964 on O‘ahu, attended Hawai‘i Community College and the University of Hawai‘i at Mānoa; and

WHEREAS, Representative Diana “Mele” Carroll served as Chief of Staff to State Senator J. Kalani English at the Hawai‘i State Senate for two years as well as his Chief of Staff at the Maui County Council for four years; and

WHEREAS, Representative Diana “Mele” Carroll also served as the Executive Assistant and the Chief Legislative Liaison to County of Maui Mayor Alan Arakawa and among her many duties was credited with writing the federal grant proposal to the United States Department of Commerce, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration for \$2 million that went to purchasing Mu‘olea Point in Hana; and

WHEREAS, Representative Diana “Mele” Carroll was appointed to the Hawai‘i State House of Representatives in 2005, representing the 13th District seat, which included the residents of East Maui, Moloka‘i, Lāna‘i, Kaho‘olawe and Molokini until February 1, 2015; and

WHEREAS, Representative Diana “Mele” Carroll is survived by her husband, Warren; daughter, Kai‘ulani Angel; mother, Magnolia “Maggie” Soares; brothers, Wayne and Jason; and sisters, Rosalynn Nuuanu and Kahealani Soares;
