

## Proclamation Presented to Bully Free Hawai'i USA

**WHEREAS**, Anti-Bullying Day, a.k.a. "Pink Shirt Day", originated in Nova Scotia, Canada, by David Shepherd and Travis Price who in 2007 bought and distributed 50 pink shirts after a make 9th grade student, Charles McNeill, was bullied for wearing a pink shirt during the first day of school; and

**WHEREAS,** in 2012, the United Nations took action in the Anti-Bullying campaign and declared the official day as May 4 which is now recognized by over 25 countries including the United States, Australia and the United Kingdom; and

**WHEREAS,** Bully Free Hawai'i USA is launching the annual Anti-Bullying Campaign on May 4, 2015 and encouraging students, teachers and community leaders to wear pink to display solidarity for the students who experience face-to-face or cyber-bullying; and

**WHEREAS,** on this day, people who participate in the Anti-Bullying Campaign are asked to wear pink, blue or purple shirts, depending on their location, to symbolize a stand against bullying; and

**WHEREAS,** Bully Free Hawai'i USA is committed to providing resources and to the continuation of this annual event to prevent bullying in the State of Hawai'i;

THEREFORE I, DAVID Y. IGE, Governor, and I, SHAN S. TSUTSUI, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Hawai'i, do hereby proclaim May 4, 2015 as

## "ANTI-BULLYING DAY"

in Hawai'i, and encourage the citizens of the Aloha State to join in and wear pink to show a unified stand against bullying.
