

Proclamation In Recognition of

Distracted Driving Awareness Month

WHEREAS, the Hawai'i Department of Transportation joins the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration in recognizing April, 2015, as Distracted Driving Awareness Month in the State of Hawai'i; and

WHEREAS, the Hawai'i State Department of Transportation recognizes that distracted driving is a behavior dangerous to drivers, passengers and non-occupants alike, and that in 2013, nationally, there were 3,154 people killed in crashes and an estimated 424,000 were injured in motor vehicle crashes involving distracted drivers; and

WHEREAS, the Hawai'i State Department of Transportation will launch a statewide campaign during the month of April to raise awareness of the deadly impacts and consequences of distracted driving; and

WHEREAS, Hawai'i State Department of Transportation is providing federal grant funds to the four county police departments to enforce the electronic mobile device law; and

WHEREAS, Hawai'i State Department of Transportation values it continuing partnerships with the Honolulu Police Department, Hawai'i Police Department, Kaua'i Police Department and Maui Police Department to increase awareness of distracted driving;

THEREFORE I, DAVID Y. IGE, Governor, and I, SHAN S. TSUTSUI, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Hawai'i, do hereby proclaim April, 2015 as

"DISTRACTED DRIVING AWARENESS MONTH"

in Hawai'i, and encourage the people of the Aloha State to join us in supporting Hawai'i State Department of Transportation and its partners in their efforts to raise awareness about distracted driving.
