



The 50th Anniversary of Koʻolau Baptist Church

WHEREAS, Koʻolau Baptist Church was established by the gathering of a small, devoted cluster of Christians, led by Pastor Max Helton and his wife, Jean (1965-1971), a young missionary couple who arrived in Hawaiʻi from Baptist International Missions; and

WHEREAS, Koʻolau Baptist Church is an independent Baptist Church with several ministries, a Vacation Bible School and annual events, such as family camp, Mother's Day dinner, Father's Day softball game and cookouts, where members can enjoy comradery and nurture their friendships with each other; and

WHEREAS, In 1974, under Pastor James Warren (1972-1976), the church founded Windward Christian School with an inaugural student body of 30 children, and under the guidance of Pastor David Marcum (1976-1980) added additional classrooms for both regular and Sunday school classes, along with a name change to Koʻolau Baptist Academy; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Alan Anger came to Koʻolau Baptist Church in 1980 and began the shift to becoming a self-supporting, independent Baptist church, received a school license from the State of Hawaiʻi for Koʻolau Baptist Academy in 1984 and implemented the "Bus Ministry" to bring in hundreds of adults and children from all over Oʻahu; and

WHEREAS, from 1991 to 2004, Pastor Thomas Bowlin guided the church through a period of construction, including a new church/school office and high school building; the school joined the American Association of Christian Schools (AACS), and in 1991 Pastor Bowlin helped found the AACS-Hawai'i; and

WHEREAS, Pastor Skip Woodfin currently serves as Senior Pastor to the church leading and counseling the congregation, overseeing ministries and events, and hosting religious conferences;

THEREFORE I, DAVID Y. IGE, Governor, and I, SHAN S. TSUTSUI, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Hawai'i, do hereby proclaim April 5 – 12, 2015 as

"KO'OLAU BAPTIST CHURCH WEEK"

in Hawai'i and encourage the people of the Aloha State to join us in recognizing the 50th Anniversary Celebration for Ko'olau Baptist Church and extend our warmest wishes for its continued service and success.
