WHEREAS, health information professionals in Hawai'i's healthcare facilities work with administrative and clinical staff to design and maintain health information systems to collect, manage and disseminate clinical, financial and administrative data in delivering quality health care; and

WHEREAS, these professionals will provide relevant education, training and the necessary resources to ensure that health information management professionals have the tools needed to perform as leaders in informatics and health intelligence: and

WHEREAS, HIMAH represents over 300 health information managers and technology professionals locally, and as a state affiliate of the American Health Information Management Association (AHIMA), is associated with over 101,000 members nationally;
