WHEREAS, the American Cancer Fund for Children, Inc. and Kids Cancer Connection, Inc. report cancer is the leading cause of death by disease among children in the United States, detected in nearly 16,000 of our country's young between infancy and the age of 15; and

WHEREAS, one in five of our nation's children loses his or her battle with cancer, while many infants, children, and teens will suffer from long-term effects of comprehensive treatment, including secondary cancers; and
