

Proclamation In Recognition of

Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month

WHEREAS, Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month reminds the public of the estimated 22,600 people in Hawai'i with developmental disabilities; and

WHEREAS, an effective way to increase awareness is by participating in community activities with the disabled, learning about disabilities, and acknowledging every individual's contribution to our community; and

WHEREAS, people are encouraged to shift their thinking from trying to "fix" a disability and instead, focus on supporting individuals with developmental disabilities; and

WHEREAS, rather than telling individuals with developmental disabilities what they should do, we should ask them what they would like to do for their community and look for ways to support their efforts; and

WHEREAS, as we treat everyone with dignity, respect and kindness, we will continue to spread aloha throughout our communities, schools, workplaces, and houses of worship so that all people are embraced; and

WHEREAS, each and every one of us can honor our diversity and contribute to making Hawai'i a better place to live;

THEREFORE I, DAVID Y. IGE, Governor, and **I, SHAN S. TSUTSUI, Lieutenant Governor** of the **State of Hawai'i**, do hereby proclaim March 2017 as

"DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES AWARENESS MONTH"

and urge all citizens of the Aloha State to recognize the abilities and contributions of people with developmental disabilities, and to engage and encourage them in their endeavors.
