WHEREAS, the National Association of Social Workers (NASW) declares that the primary mission of the social work profession is to enhance human well-being and help meet the basic needs of all people, especially the most vulnerable in society; and

WHEREAS, NASW asserts that all children have the right to a healthy and safe environment and quality education, and elderly adults have the right to dignity of caregiving; and

WHEREAS, access to community support for veterans and their families is a major priority to ensure their successful transition after service; and

WHEREAS, NASW emphasizes that access to mental health treatment and health care services saves millions of lives; and

WHEREAS, NASW Hawai'i is actively involved in advocacy at the state and local level, working with the Women's Legislative Coalition, Keiki Caucus, Kupuna Caucus and the Mental Health Task Force; and

WHEREAS, NASW Hawai'i provides resources for members, raises funds for scholarships, recognizes those who make significant contributions in the field of social work or support social work causes; and

WHEREAS, the numerous contributions made by over 600,000 social workers in the country, including over 3,000 in Hawai'i, should be recognized because they provide much needed services that improve the well-being of everyone in our community;

THEREFORE I, DAVID Y. IGE, Governor, and I, SHAN S. TSUTSUI, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Hawai'i, do hereby proclaim March 2017 as

and ask that the citizens of the Aloha State join us in recognizing the importance of the social work profession and the invaluable contributions of social workers in bringing about positive change in our community.
