WHEREAS, all Hawai'i's road users should always be vigilant of others by following traffic laws, checking blind spots, slowing in school zones and yielding to pedestrians; and

WHEREAS, Pedestrian Safety Month highlights the promotion efforts of numerous organizations, such as the Hawai'i State Department of Transportation, the Hawai'i State Department of Health, Hawai'i County Police Department, Honolulu Police Department, Kaua'i Police Department, Maui Police Department, Federal Highway Administration, the City & County of Honolulu's Department of Transportation Services, Safety Routes to School, Neighbor Security Watch Teams, DTRIC Insurance, First Hawaiian Bank, Girl Scouts of Hawai'i, HMSA, Institute for Human Services, McDonald's Restaurants of Hawai'i, Moms In Hawai'i, and Walk Wise Hawai'i; and
