## **INDICTMENT**

The Grand Jury charges:

COUNT 1: On or about June 9, 2013, to and including August 17, 2015, in the City and County of Honolulu, State of Hawai'i, LESLIE L.C. TRUGLIO, as one scheme and/or continuing course of conduct, did obtain or exert control over the property of John Cruz, the value of which exceeds twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00), with intent to deprive John Cruz

of the property, thereby committing the offense of Theft in the First Degree, in violation of Sections 708-830(1) & 708-830.5(1)(a), of the Hawaii Revised Statutes.

If convicted of this offense or any included felony offense, LESLIE L.C. TRUGLIO may be subject to sentencing in accordance with Section 706-661 and Section 706-662(4)(a) of the Hawai'i Revised Statutes where she is a multiple offender in that she is being sentenced for two or more felonies, and an extended term of imprisonment is necessary for the protection of the public.

COUNT 2: On or about June 9, 2013, to and including August 17, 2015, in the City and County of Honolulu, State of Hawai'i, LESLIE L.C. TRUGLIO, as one scheme and/or continuing course of conduct, did knowingly access a computer, computer system, or computer network with the intent to commit the offense of Theft in the First Degree, thereby committing the offense of Computer Fraud in the First Degree, in violation of Section 708-891(1) of the Hawaii Revised Statutes.

If convicted of this offense or any included felony offense, LESLIE L.C. TRUGLIO may be subject to sentencing in accordance with Section 706-661 and Section 706-662(4)(a) of the Hawai'i Revised Statutes where she is a multiple offender in that she is being sentenced for two or more felonies, and an extended term of imprisonment is necessary for the protection of the public.
