

Proclamation In Recognition of

Hawai'i Blood Donation Day

WHEREAS, the State of Hawai'i is committed to ensuring the safety, health, and well-being of all those living in and visiting our state; and

WHEREAS, blood and blood products play a vital role in the state's public healthcare and emergency disaster preparedness program; and

WHEREAS, hospital programs, including organ transplants, neonatal care, oncology, cardiology, and trauma, rely on a safe and reliable supply of blood to save lives; and

WHEREAS, the Blood Bank of Hawai'i is the sole provider of blood for all civilian hospitals throughout O'ahu and the neighbor islands; and

WHEREAS, the statewide supply is currently provided by 2 percent of Hawai'i's population who donate blood, with over 23,000 whole blood donors and about 900 platelet donors annually; and

WHEREAS, approximately 200 blood donors are needed every day to meet the State's patient need; and

WHEREAS, because we live on a remote island chain in the Pacific Ocean, it is especially critical that the State of Hawai'i sustain its own safe and reliable blood supply on our shelves; and

WHEREAS, Hawai'i Blood Donation Day reminds the citizens of Hawai'i that it is up to all of us to meet the need to replenish Hawai'i's blood supply through donation and community awareness;

THEREFORE I, DAVID Y. IGE, Governor, and I, SHAN S. TSUTSUI, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Hawai'i, do hereby proclaim September 8, 2017 as

"HAWAI'I BLOOD DONATION DAY"

and ask the people of the Aloha State to join us to recognize the importance of blood donation and urge members of our community to consider becoming a donor.
