In Recognition of
Window Film Day

WHEREAS, window film is an affordable alternative for homeowners as they update their homes with energy efficient options; and

WHEREAS, the use of window film helps both consumers and businesses save money on their energy bills and reduce peak demand for electricity when utilities are challenged to meet those needs; and

WHEREAS, window film holds glass together upon breakage, providing a safer and more secure environment for homeowners, commercial buildings, retail establishments, hospitals, hotels, and condominiums; and

WHEREAS, professionally installed window film creates a healthier environment, blocking up to 99% of UV rays; and

WHEREAS, window film on automobiles helps block out dangerous solar rays from negatively affecting the health of Hawai'i drivers by shielding their eyes from solar glare and protecting their skin to prevent cancer; and

WHEREAS, the window film industry is committed to raising public awareness of all the benefits of window film through the International Window Film Association, a nonprofit trade association;

THEREFORE I, DAVID Y. IGE, Governor, and I, DOUGLAS S. CHIN, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Hawai'i, do hereby proclaim April 30, 2018 as

“Window Film Day”
