

Proclamation Presented to

Hawai'i COPD Coalition

WHEREAS, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) is a chronic, systemic disease, which includes emphysema, chronic bronchitis and chronic asthma; and

WHEREAS, COPD is the third leading killer in the United States and is the only one of the top ten killers that continues to increase in number; and

WHEREAS, COPD kills more than 120,000 Americans every year, which equates to one death every four minutes; and

WHEREAS, in the United States, more than 15 million adults are diagnosed with COPD while an equal or greater number of undiagnosed sufferers exist; and

WHEREAS, smoking and secondhand smoke remain major causes of COPD, but it is estimated that one in six COPD patients never smoked; and

WHEREAS, a genetic form of COPD, Alpha-1 Antitrypsin Deficiency (Alpha-1), affects about 4 percent of those who have COPD but is under-diagnosed and under-treated due to lack of awareness; and

WHEREAS, the Hawai'i COPD Coalition seeks to increase awareness of COPD in Hawai'i by offering resources and providing individualized information about lung health, free monthly support group meetings and an annual education day; and

WHEREAS, November has been designated National COPD Month since 2001, and citizens are encouraged to wear orange, the color recognized as the national color for COPD; and

WHEREAS, Wednesday, November 21, 2018 has been designated as World COPD Day as well as Hawai'i COPD and Alpha-1 Day;

THEREFORE I, DAVID Y. IGE, Governor, and I, DOUGLAS S. CHIN, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Hawai'i, do hereby proclaim November 2018 as

"HAWAI'I COPD AND ALPHA-1 MONTH"

in Hawai'i and ask the people of the Aloha State to join us in raising awareness of COPD and educating the public about risk factors, testing and treatment options such as tobacco cessation, pulmonary rehabilitation and exercise.
