

Proclamation

WHEREAS, more than 50 years after the passage of the Equal Pay Act, women, especially minority women, continue to suffer the effects of unequal pay; and

WHEREAS, according to the U.S. Census Bureau, women in Hawai'i working full time in 2017 typically earned 81 percent of what men earned, indicating insufficient change or progress in pay equity; and

WHEREAS, one estimate indicates that educated women working full time earn more than a half million dollars less than their male peers over the course of a lifetime, which means women have less income to save for retirement and less income counted toward a Social Security or pension benefit; and

WHEREAS, nearly four in ten mothers are primary breadwinners in their households, and nearly twothirds are primary or significant earners, making pay equity critical to a family's economic security; and

WHEREAS, the annual "Fight for Pay Equity: A State Road Map for Hawai'i" by American Association of University Women provides suggestions for legislative fixes; and

WHEREAS, fair pay equity policies can be implemented simply and without undue costs or hardships in both the public and private sectors; and

WHEREAS, fair pay strengthens the security of families today and eases future retirement costs while enhancing the American economy; and

WHEREAS, Tuesday, April 2 is the end date of the extra months in 2019 a woman must work in order to earn the same wages that a man earned in 2018;

THEREFORE, I, David Y. Ige, Governor and I, JOSHUA B. GREEN, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Hawai'i, do hereby proclaim April 2, 2019 as

"EQUAL PAY DAY"

in Hawai'i and urge the citizens of the Aloha State to join us in recognizing the full value of women's skills and the significant contributions they have made to Hawai'i's labor force and further encourage businesses to conduct an internal pay evaluation to ensure women are being paid fairly.
