

Proclamation

WHEREAS, according to the World Health Organization, 37.9 million people worldwide are living with HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus) and 770,000 worldwide died from HIV/AIDS (Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome) as of end of 2018; and

WHEREAS, there are more than 2,400 persons currently living with HIV in Hawai'i and approximately 400 persons living with HIV in Hawai'i are not receiving HIV care; and

WHEREAS, barriers such as stigma, discrimination, homelessness, behavioral health and substance use continue to hinder successful HIV prevention, testing and treatment; and

WHEREAS, the "Hawai'i to Zero" campaign aims to end the HIV epidemic with zero new HIV infections, zero deaths related to HIV, and zero HIV-related stigma; and

WHEREAS, for people who are at high risk of exposure to HIV, the Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis medication prevents transmission of the HIV virus if taken consistently; and

WHEREAS, people living with HIV often experience loneliness and isolation, and it is critical that they have access to and receive appropriate HIV medical care and support; and

WHEREAS, while great progress has been made in treatment for those living with HIV/AIDS, and new prevention strategies can prevent new infections, there is still no cure for HIV/AIDS;

THEREFORE I, DAVID Y. IGE, Governor, and **I, JOSHUA B. GREEN**, **Lieutenant Governor** of the **State of Hawai'i**, do hereby proclaim December 1, 2019 as

"WORLD AIDS DAY"

in Hawai'i and ask the people of the Aloha State to join us in the fight against HIV/AIDS and Rock the Ribbon Together to show support for people living with HIV and commemorate those who have died from AIDS-related illnesses.
