CARES ACT FUNDING RELEASED BY GOV. DAVID IGE SUPPORTS STATEWIDE HEALTHCARE WORKERS

Oct. 26, 2020

CARES Act Funding:

- In total, over 170 healthcare professionals are in Hawai'i to support and reinforce healthcare facilities across the state, from hospitals to long term care facilities
- Approved by Gov. Ige and administered through the Dept. of Health, a contract of \$17 million – in federal dollars – has been negotiated with ProLink to bring trained, licensed and COVID-free medical personnel to augment Hawai'i's healthcare workforce
