

Proclamation

WHEREAS, credit unions are not-for-profit financial cooperatives, democratically owned and operated and founded by people working together toward economic advancement; and

WHEREAS, credit unions embrace a "people-helping-people" philosophy through the pooling of personal resources and leadership abilities for the good of the cooperative, empowering members to improve their financial futures and uniting to help those in need; and

WHEREAS, have demonstrated outstanding leadership throughout the communities in which they have served and are celebrating the 72nd anniversary of International Credit Union (ICU) Day; and

WHEREAS, with more than 85,000 credit unions and over 274 million members in 188 countries worldwide, credit unions have chosen the theme "Inspiring Hope for a Global Community" which speaks to how each credit union serves a local community; and

WHEREAS, in Hawai'i, more than 824,000 members have access to a vast array of financial services from their own credit unions; and

WHEREAS, ICU Day 2020 is a celebration of the impact credit unions and other financial cooperatives have made and continue to make for their members and their communities;

THEREFORE I, DAVID Y. IGE, Governor of the **State of Hawai'i,** do hereby proclaim October 15, 2020 as

"INTERNATIONAL CREDIT UNION DAY"

in Hawai'i and ask the people of the Aloha State to recognize the many contributions credit unions have made to the communities in Hawai'i through the years and honor and express appreciation for the service and commitment of credit unions.
