

Proclamation

WHEREAS, neuroendocrine tumors (NETs) are cancers which arise from neuroendocrine cells found throughout the body, often occuring in the lung, pancreas and digestive system; and

WHEREAS, NETs can spread to other parts of the body such as the lymph nodes, liver or bones; and

WHEREAS, symptoms such as abdominal pain, diarrhea, bloating, skin rash and heartburn are commonly associated with many other conditions, making NETs easily misdiagnosed; and

WHEREAS, a misdiagnosis or delayed diagnosis can have a negative impact on a patient's chance of survival and quality of life; and

WHEREAS, survival for NET cancer patients is further compromised by fragmented care and lack of access to treatment by specialists; and

WHEREAS, although there have been advances in the detection and treatment of NET cancers, not all patients are benefiting quickly enough from the scientific and medical progress in the field; and

WHEREAS, with early diagnosis and proper treatment, NET cancer patients can have significantly improved outcomes and quality of life;

THEREFORE I, DAVID Y. IGE, Governor of the **State of Hawai'i,** do hereby proclaim November 10, 2020 as

"NET CANCER AWARENESS DAY"

in Hawai'i and ask the people of the Aloha State to join me in raising awareness of NET cancers and the need for timely diagnosis and access to optimal treatment and care.
