WHEREAS, National Volunteer Week has been endorsed by the President and Congress and Volunteer Week Hawai'i has been endorsed by the Hawai'i State Legislature; and

WHEREAS, Hawai'i is proud of the volunteers who serve our community with pride and commitment; and

WHEREAS, Volunteer Week Hawai'i encourages volunteers to lend their time and talents and connect with community service opportunities through hundreds of local service organizations;
