A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS BY MAIL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 136, Session 2 Laws of Hawaii 2019, required all elections statewide to be 3 conducted by mail beginning with the 2020 primary election. 4 The purpose of this Act is to: 5 Amend the State's election laws to clarify and improve (1) 6 the administration of elections by mail; 7 Establish voters with special needs advisory (2) 8 committees; 9 (3) Require the department of public safety and Hawaii 10 paroling authority to inform individuals on parole or 11 probation of their right to vote and provide them with 12 information on how to register and vote; and Require the office of elections and the county clerks 13 (4) 14 to make a determination, as soon as practicable, of the optimal number and placement of voter service 15 16 centers.
