

Proclamation

WHEREAS, Autism, or Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) refers to a broad range of conditions characterized by challenges with social skills, repetitive behaviors, speech and nonverbal communication; and

WHEREAS, in 2021, the Centers for Disease Control reported that Autism affects approximately 1 in every 44 children in the United States, and is about four times more common among boys than girls; and

WHEREAS, 35.2% of children with Autism also have an intellectual disability; and

WHEREAS, nearly two-thirds of children with Autism between the ages of 6-15 have been bullied; and

WHEREAS, in Hawai'i, 10% of children ages 3-21 who receive special education services live with Autism; and

WHEREAS. Autism occurs in all racial, ethnic, and socioeconomic groups; and

WHEREAS, children with Autism grow up to be adults with Autism who need continuous family and government support for health, educational, social and welfare supports, particularly if they are not treated early in life;

THEREFORE I, DAVID Y. IGE, Governor of the State of Hawai'i, do hereby proclaim April 2022 as

"AUTISM ACCEPTANCE MONTH"

in Hawai'i and ask the people of the Aloha State to join me in raising awareness of Autism and help build an inclusive society where individuals with Autism live fully through connection and acceptance.
