



# Proclamation

**WHEREAS**, over the next decade, manufacturers will need to fill 4.6 million jobs across the country; and

**WHEREAS**, modern manufacturing is a technology-driven industry that offers secure, well-paying jobs; and

**WHEREAS**, Manufacturing Day gives students, parents, teachers, and community and government leaders an opportunity to learn about what manufacturing is and what it is not; and

**WHEREAS**, companies and educational institutions are encouraged to share their facilities and information on Manufacturing Day to educate future generations, remove misconceptions about manufacturing, address the skilled labor shortage and ensure the prosperity of the manufacturing industry; and

**WHEREAS**, the Chamber of Commerce Hawai'i, as the state's leading business organization since 1850, represents about 2,000 businesses, works on behalf of its membership to improve the state's economic climate and foster positive action on issues of common concern, and is the exclusive affiliate in the State of Hawai'i for the National Association of Manufacturers; and

**WHEREAS**, the INNOVATE Hawai'i program is administered by the Hawai'i Technology Development Corporation and assists small to medium-sized manufacturers and pre-manufacturers to expand their business for the global market and is an affiliate center of the National Institute of Standards and Technology's (NIST) Hollings Manufacturing Extension Partnership (MEP);
